

## **FORTY HOURS DEVOTIONS**

Sacred Heart's annual celebration of Forty Hours will take place Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, November 18, 19 and 20. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed after the closing prayer of the 11:00 AM Mass on Sunday. The Church will be open for adoration Sunday afternoon, as well as throughout the night Sunday and Monday, and following the 8:30 AM Mass Monday and Tuesday. We invite and encourage you to spend time before our Lord and Savior, present in the Eucharist. Adoration sign-up sheets will be at both entrances of the Church next weekend.

The format for the 6:30 PM evening liturgies will be a scripture service (similar to the Liturgy of the Word of Holy Mass), followed by Benediction. Father Brian Miller will serve as homilist. Father Miller was born and raised in Reading, and ordained to the priesthood in 2010. Currently, Father Miller is the pastor of St. Joseph the Worker Parish in Frackville and chaplain of Marian Catholic High School.

- Exposition/Adoration
- Rosary at 12:00 Noon
- 6:30 PM Scripture Service/Benediction, followed by Confessions. The theme of Fr. Miller's homily: "Christ, the Bearer of our Wounded Hearts."
- Adoration continues throughout the night, with simple reposition before Mass on Tuesday.

### **Tuesday, November 20**

- 8:30 AM Mass
- Exposition/Adoration
- Rosary at 12:00 Noon
- 6:30 PM Scripture Service, Procession with the Most Blessed Sacrament, Benediction, Reposition. The theme of Fr. Miller's homily: "Christ, the Healer of our Wounded Hearts."
