What is staying the same? What is changing?
The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation will remain in place. Mass attendance remains voluntary. Those who do not feel safe, or who have compromising health conditions, should not attend.

Sacred Heart will continue with our modified Mass schedule.

Weekday Mass--Tuesday and Thursday at 8 am

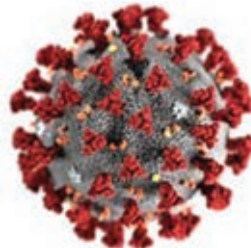
Weekend Mass--Saturday 5 pm & Sunday 9 am

There will continue to be limited seating capacity available in the Church. The Green Phase Part I guidelines allow for an increased capacity of *up to 50%* of the Church capacity, dependent on configuration and size of pews. At Sacred Heart, every other pew is now open for seating, compared to every third pew, so our seating capacity increases to 50 persons per Mass/service.

For now, reservations are still required for **weekend** Masses. Please call the Parish Office at 610-837-7874.

Long-handled baskets may be used to take up the offertory collection.

All other restrictions remain in place, including social distancing and face masks required.

HOW TO PREPARE FOR RETURNING TO MASS AND WHAT TO EXPECT

† Please use the ramp door (back) for entrance/exit to the Church. The Church doors on Washington Street will remain locked.

† Every second pew will be open for seating. Please honor the closed pew restrictions.

† Seating will only be on the ends of the open pews, with no more than 3 persons per pew (excluding families). Ushers will assist with seating for weekend Masses.

† Our current seating capacity inside the Church at any one time will be limited to 50.

† Due to capacity limits, we will have a **reservation process in place for Weekend Masses**. Please call the Parish Office no earlier than Monday at 8:00 am and no later than Friday at noon before the weekend Mass to reserve a seat for one of the two weekend Masses. Once our seating capacity is reached, that Mass will be deemed "full" and you will need to wait to attend one of the following weekend or daily Masses.

When you arrive to Church the ushers will make sure you are on the reservation list for that Mass. Please be patient as we all work through this process.

† Please bring and wear your face mask while inside the Church. You will not be allowed in the building without a face mask.

† Respect social distancing of at least 6 feet at all times, both inside and outside of Church.

† Please use the provided hand sanitizer in the entrances and pews as needed.

† Our ushers will help enforce these guidelines. Please respect instructions.

† All hymnals and pamphlets/prayer cards have been temporarily removed from Church due to the difficulty of keeping them disinfected.

† Holy Communion will be distributed. If you choose to receive on the tongue, please wait to get in line until after all those receiving by hand have received.

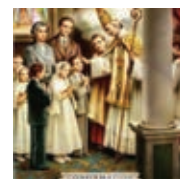

THE PRO-LIFE CORNER

Why is abortion always wrong? Why is it the pre-eminent issue among the "UNITED STATES COUNCIL OF AMERICAN BISHOPS?" More important than capital punishment, immigration policy, social justices issues, etc. Because it is taking of innocent, human life. Emphasis on the words innocent and human. The best pro-homily (and we don't have enough of them) I have ever heard was years ago by the head of Human Life International, Fr. Paul Marx. Fr. Marx is now deceased. On November 17, 1979, Fr. Marx had an audience with Pope John Paul II. After describing to the Holy Father his international work, Fr. Marx remembered, "For an uncomfortably long time, the Pope looked at me as if in prayer, and then finally said, "You have lots of experience. You must bring this pro-life, pro-family movement all over the Earth; and if you do that you will be doing the most important work on Earth."

Fr. Marx was a small, elderly man at the time he visited our parish in Warren, NJ years ago. He started his homily, "Do I believe in birth control? You bet I do; I practice it all of the time." He also called Planned Parenthood, the main provider of abortions in our country, planned barrenhood and banned parenthood.

In last week's column, I wrote about the Supreme Court's decision in 1973, Roe vs. Wade, and Doe vs. Bolton, which ultimately prohibited the states from outlawing abortion up to the moment of birth. How did the justices decide that abortion was a constitutional right? After all, the constitution clearly states that: "Any right not given explicitly to the Federal Government, belongs to the states." The majority justified their decision by stating that, although nowhere does the constitution mention abortion, they found a penumbra (the partially shaded outer region of the shadow cast by an opaque object, kind of a halo). Wow! Who would have thought that such a thing was imagined by the Founding Fathers! I wonder how many other "penumbras" are in there?

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

PARISH MEMORIALS

Following the death of a relative or friend, offerings may be made to the Church in loving memory of the deceased. Offerings may specify a particular request or be placed in the Memorial Fund for parish needs.

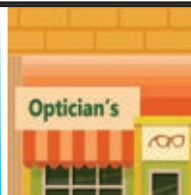

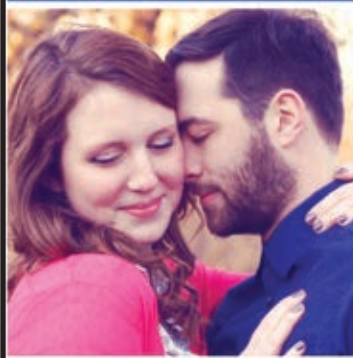
