

FORTY HOURS DEVOTIONS

Sacred Heart's annual celebration of Forty Hours will take place Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, November 13, 14, and 15. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed after the closing prayer of the 11:00 AM Mass on Sunday. The Church will be open for adoration Sunday afternoon, as well as throughout the night Sunday and Monday, and following 8:00 am Mass on Monday and Tuesday. We invite and encourage you to spend time before our Lord and Savior, present in the Eucharist. Adoration sign-up sheets are posted in the ramp entrance vestibule.

The format for the 6:30 PM devotions will be evening prayer, followed by Benediction. This is a very special time in the life of our Parish, because it is an opportunity to renew our devotion to our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Plan to attend the liturgies, and sign-up for at least an hour of adoration.



FATHER JOHN BARBELLA, HOMILIST FOR FORTY HOURS

I was born in Queens, New York, but grew up in New Jersey. I first felt that I might want to be a priest when I was about 6 or 7 years old. By age 14, I was certain that God was calling me to the priesthood.

After earning a degree in History from Montclair State College, I entered Mount Saint Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD, where I earned degrees in Theology and Church History. I was ordained to the sacred priesthood on May 30, 1987 by Bishop Edward T. Hughes at St. Francis of Assisi Cathedral in Metuchen, NJ. Since then, I have served as a parochial vicar (associate pastor) in St. Mary's Church in Alpha, NJ, Our Lady of Mt. Virgin Church in Middlesex, NJ, St. Matthias Church in Somerset, NJ, and St. Bernard of Clairvaux Church in Bridgewater, NJ. Before assuming my current pastorate at St. John Vianney Church in Colonia, NJ, I served as pastor of Ss. Philip and James Church in Phillipsburg, NJ, Holy Rosary and Holy Spirit Churches in Perth Amboy, NJ, and St. Jude's Church in Blairstown, NJ.

I believe that teaching the faith is among a priest's most important duties – and teach 8th and 4th grade religion in my parish school each week. I have also taught 5th and 8th grade CCD at times.

I believe a priest's main job is to help people get to Heaven. To this end, I do my best to help people get to know and love and serve God here on earth.

The Holy Mass is the absolute center and high point of my day. Time spent with our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament is another indispensable part of my prayer life. For this reason, I encourage people to make every effort to get to Daily Mass as much as they can, and make time for a Holy Hour at least weekly.

My other interests include following sports – especially baseball – and watching, modeling, and photographing trains. Reading about history – especially Church history – and baseball are also fun pastimes for me. Gathering with my extended family is also a big part of my life.

I am honored that Fr. Butera asked me to preach Forty Hours at Sacred Heart, and ask that you pray for me as the Forty Hours approaches. My parishioners know that I always ask them to pray at least one Hail Mary for me each day. If you could do the same, I would really appreciate it.



PRO-LIFE CORNER

The most recent issue of the AD times has an excellent article on a talk given by Fr. Stephen Isaac, Asst. Pastor at the Cathedral of St. Catharine of Siena, Allentown. Fr. Isaac had a number of suggestions of what to say to someone who is supports abortion.

Here are some of the examples that he gives:

"My body, my choice". The baby is not your body. It is another person's body - a genetically unique, distinct human being - and its life needs to be respected the same as yours.

"A fetus is not human." When a woman is pregnant, what is she pregnant with? We know by reason and experience that a woman is pregnant with another human being. Human life, beginning at conception, is not a religious or philosophical belief, but a scientific objective standard of medical science and biological fact that is observable by any objective standard of medical science.

SAINT MARGARET OF SCOTLAND -Feast Day Nov. 16
SAINT ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY—Feast Day Nov. 17

These two saints have feast days the week of November 14th. Both of these women had a lot in common. For example they came from wealthy families, married influential husbands whom they loved, both were dedicated mothers , and unfortunately were also widowed. These two spiritual women were devout in there faith and were blessed with husbands who supported their religious beliefs, commitment to prayer and their need to help the poor.

Saint Margaret of Scotland: Margaret’s kind natured and good heart was a strong influence on her husband King Malcolm Canmore III of Scotland. She softened his temper and together they prayed, fed the hungry and offered a powerful example of living the faith in action. Margaret helped build churches and is known for her deep life of prayer and piety. She constantly worked to aid the poor, encouraged people to live a devout life, grow in prayer and holiness. She was referred to as “The Pearl of Scotland.” Margaret never questioned her love for Our Lord.

Saint Elizabeth of Hungary: Elizabeth was very young when her father arranged her to be married to Ludwig IV of Thuringia, a German nobleman. She continued to live a life full of prayer and services to the poor and sick. She began to live a simple life, practiced penance, and devoted herself to works of charity in caring for the diseased. She used her royal position to advance her mission in charity. Ludwig and Elizabeth were politically powerful and lived a remarkable generosity toward the poor and needy. Elizabeth had a hospital built to care of the sick . Her faith in Our Lord never was in question.

We should read more about these powerful Saints and make an effort to see if we can somehow live our lives as these holy people. Can you help a neighbor or loved one with transportation, food, spiritual conversation or just being there? If the answer is yes, do not hesitate to do so. The smallest gesture can be the biggest act of faith.



The location where you receive your sacraments is governed by the territorial boundaries of the Parish within which you live, as prescribed by the Code of Canon Law. As a reminder, and to prevent delay or confusion when the time nears for the sacraments (and sacramental preparation), reception is not governed by where one attends school nor by where you attend Mass nor receive Religious Education. For example, if you live in the territorial boundaries of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and your 2nd grader attends Good Shepherd School in Northampton, they will receive their Religious Education from Good Shepherd School, but receive the sacrament of First Holy Communion at Sacred Heart. GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

A Priest or Deacon will visit monthly. Extraordinary Ministers visit those who wish to receive more often. Always notify us about the homebound parishioners who wish to be visited.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS
